## ARMA Vancouver to Provide RIM **Education, Training to First Nations**

he ARMA Vancouver Chapter continues it work to help build records and information management (RIM) capacity in First Nations communities in British Columbia and the Yukon. After a successful inaugural event at Musqueam First Nation last year, the chapter is gearing up to co-host the 2nd Annual First Nations RIM Symposia in Whitehorse on April 11-12 and in Vancouver on June 5-6.



"There is a growing need for RIM training for First Nations as they build capacity on becoming self-governing and to help develop their infrastructure compliant to feder-

al reporting and auditing rules," organizers wrote. "The focus of these symposia is on practical knowledge and skills that participants will be able to bring home and utilize."

According to the Vancouver chapter, this year's program will include two half day pre-conferences: 1) a records management boot camp and 2) a case study on shared drive restructure. Topics will include archives and preservation; planning for an electronic records and management system; building a records classification scheme; and freedom of information and protection of privacy
